A) 2013 Activities:	<p>The Michigan Section holds quarterly meetings at various locations around the State to engage members living in different geographical areas. Most meetings are staged at Universities to allow participation by Student Chapters and faculty sponsors. We begin with an executive committee meeting, followed by a social hour, dinner, and guest speaker presenting a topic of interest to our membership.</p> <p>The March meeting was held at Central Michigan University and Nick Swiger of the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality presented upcoming changes to policy documents related to non-aqueous phased liquids (NAPL) and pending reugulatory changes.</p> <p>The May meeting was held in conjunction with the Michgian Geological Society of America (GSA) at Western Michigan University. We manned an AIPG booth, provided AIPG handouts to meeting attendees and sponsored refreshments after the presentation sessions.</p> <p>The September meeting was held at Cleary University and John Esch, MDEQ provided an introduction to GeoWebFace - an online tool for reviewing geological data, hydrogeological data, and oil & gas data for Michigan. The quarterly meetings have improved visibility for the AIPG and increased participation by our professional and student chapter members.</p> <p>The Michigan Section also conducted a three-day work shop in June focusing on "The Power of Partnership-Owners, Consultants, and Regulators." This was the third consecutive year for what has become a popular educational and networking event. About 160 participants representing industry, regulatory agencies, and consulting firms participated.</p> <p>The Michigan Section hosts an annual golf outing in May to raise funds for educational grants and scholarships. About 70 members and guests participated.</p> <p>In June, the Section sponsored a joint field trip with the Michigan Basin Geological Society, visiting outcrops and geological features in the western upper penninsula.</p> <p>During 2013, the Michigan Section pledged \$3,500 in scholarship money for Michigan teachers participating in the MDNR's Academy of Natural</p>




